

Rimrose Valley is a natural green space used by the communities surrounding the park for many years. Reclamation of the site started in 1993 with the aim of improving the area as both a recreational and educational resource for local people. The site now has two Sites of Special Local Biological Interest (SLBI's), at Brookvale Local Nature Reserve and also vast reed beds at Fulwood Way to the east of the site. The country park is a well established popular area of countryside in the south of Sefton.



Since February 2015, Rimrose Valley Friends has existed to promote and improve the wonderful community resource that is Rimrose Valley Country Park. In 2017 Highways England announced a proposal to build a high speed dual carriageway through the park to link the Port of Liverpool to the motorway network at Switch Island, effectively destroying the park as a community resource. Rimrose Valley Friends (RVF) is actively engaged in a vigorous campaign to save the park from destruction via the Road Action Group.

Any funds raised will be put towards the campaign to Save Rimrose Valley.
